NOTIFICATION.

VESTING ORDER.

IN THE MATTER OF THE CHARITABLE ENDOWMENTS ACT, 1890

AND

IN THE MATTER OF THE INDIAN INSTITUTE OF SCIENCE.

WHEREAS Jamssetjee Nusserwanjee Tata late of Bombay, Parsee gentleman, some time before his death, which took place on the 19th day of May 1904, made a proposal to the Government of India for founding an Institute of Research in India and endowing such Institute with immoveable properties in the City of Bombay producing an annual net rental of not less than Rs. 1,25,000 and applied to the said Government for aid to and co-operation in that Scheme AND WHEREAS the lands described in Schedule C hereto have been selected for the location of the said Institute and the Government of His Highness the Maharajah of Mysore by Resolution bearing No. G-5639-G.M. 232-06-9 and dated 14th March 1907 published in the Mysore Gazette copy of which Resolution is given in Schedule D hereto assigned to the Governor-General of India in Council with effect from the 14th day of March 1907 the exclusive management of and full jurisdiction over the said lands for so long as the said lands are used for the purposes of the said Institute AND WHEREAS the Government of His Highness the Maharajah of Mysore has by letters dated 26th day of July and ^{29th}_{29th} day of December 1905, copies of which collectively are given in Schedule E hereto, agreed to supplement the income of the said Institute by an annual permanent grant of Rs. 50,000 contingent upon the location of the said Institute in Bangalore and by letter dated 16th of November 1901 copy whereof is given in Schedule F hereto has also agreed to provide a sum of Rs. 5,00,000 towards the construction and erection of the buildings of the said Institute and other initial expenditure required for the purposes of the said Institute AND WHEREAS the Government of India have by letter to the Government of Bombay No. 156 dated 28th February 1905 an extract wherefrom is given in Schedule G hereto agreed to supplement the income for the time being of the said Institute by an annual grant to be made by that Government equivalent to one equal half of the income of the said Institute from time to time derived from "local assets" as defined in paragraph 5 of the said letter, but so that the total amount of such grant shall not at any time exceed Rs. 1,50,000 and also to make a grant of Rs. 2,50,000 towards the construction of the necessary buildings and other initial expenditure required for the purposes of the said Institute AND WHEREAS in pursuance and for the purpose of carrying into effect the said proposal Dorabjee Jamssetjee Tata and Ruttonjee Jamssetjee Tata the sons and Executors and residuary legatees of the said



Jamsetjee Nusserwanjee Tata have made an application to the Governor-General in Council that the properties specified in Schedule A hereto with the benefit of and subject to the covenants, agreements conditions and terms set forth in Schedule B hereto may in pursuance of the provisions of the Charitable Endowments Act 1890 (Act VI of 1890) be vested in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments for the territories subject to the Government of Bombay upon the terms as to the application of the said property and the income thereof hereinafter referred to which terms have been agreed upon between the Governor-General in Council and the said Dorabjee Jamsetjee Tata and Ruttonjee Jamsetjee Tata.

Now in pursuance and by virtue of Sections 4 and 7 of the Charitable Endowments Act 1890 His Excellency the Governor-General of India in Council hereby orders that the properties specified in Schedule A hereto annexed with the benefit of and subject to the covenants agreements conditions and terms set forth in Schedule B hereto annexed be and the same are hereby vested in the Treasurer of Charitable Endowments for the Territories subject to the Government of Bombay upon the following terms, that is to say, that the said lands in or near Bangalore shall be used for the erection of the buildings of the said Institute (intended to be called and known by the name of the Indian Institute of Science) and that the said land and buildings shall be appropriated and occupied in perpetuity for the purposes of the said Institute that the said sums of Rs. 5,00,000, and Rs. 2,50,000 shall be expended towards the construction and erection of the buildings of the said Institute and other initial expenditure of the said Institute and that the balance of the said funds in the hands of the said Provisional Committee, the said annual grant of Rs. 50,000 by the Government of His Highness the Maharaja of Mysore and such grant as may be annually made by the Government of India and also the income of the immovable properties in Bombay described in Schedule A hereto shall be collected and received by the persons appointed for the purpose under the Scheme settled under Sections 5 and 7 of the said Act and hereto annexed and marked with the letter H to be by them applied in the manner set forth in the said Scheme.

S.O. 3903 - In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of Section 3-B of the City of Bangalore Municipal Corporation Act 1949 (Mysore Act 69 of 1949), the Government of Mysore hereby exclude from the limits of the Corporation of the City of Bangalore the local area of the Indian Institute of Science situated within the City of Bangalore specified in schedule I and the boundary of the said area specified in schedule II, with effect from the 15th February 1966, a draft of the said proposal having been published as S.O. 3554, dated 30th November 1965 in Part IV, Section 2-C (11) of the Mysore Gazette dated 2nd December 1965.

SCHEDULE II

The Boundary line of the Indian Institute of Science runs as follows:


The boundary commences from the south-east corner stone of S.No.

24 of Vaialikaval village and meets the north-west corner stone, S.No.23 of the said village. Thence it turns towards north and runs along side the south-east border of Yewanthapura village after crossing Bangalore-Tuskur Concrete Road and meets the south-west corner stone of S.No.22 of Vaialikaval village. Again it turns towards east and runs along side the southern border of S.No.22, 20 of Vaialikaval village and meets the south-east corner stone of S.No. 20 of Vaialikaval village. Further it turns towards north and runs along side the eastern border of S.No.20 of Vaialikaval village and meets the south-east corner stone of S.No.15 of Mathikere village. Thence it turns towards north and runs along side the eastern border of S.No.13, 14, 15, 17, 18, 36, 43 and 44 of Mathikere village and meets the south-west corner stone of S.No.10 of Mathikere village at its juncture with the newly formed City Improvement Trust Board Road. Thence it runs in an easterly direction along side the southern border of 100' proposed Gokul II stage City Improvement Trust Board Road till it reaches the Pipe line in S.No. 26 of Dyvasandra village. Further it runs south-wards and runs in a southerly direction cutting across S.No. 26, 24, 15 and 18 of Dyvasandra village along the eastern fencing of the Indian Institute of Science and meets the middle-stone of the northern boundary of S.No.19 of Vaialikaval village. Thence it runs in an easterly direction and meets the north-east corner stone of S.No.18 of Vaialikaval village. Further it turns in a southerly direction and runs along the western boundary of the pipeline road to join concrete road (old Tuskur-Bangalore Road). Thence after crossing the above said road joins the western portion of the Walls of S.No.2 of Raja Mahal village to join the south-east corner stone of S.No.1 of Tata Institute village ~~for junction with the Bangalore-Tuskur concrete road~~ after running along side the northern and western boundary of Forest Research Institute. Thence it turns towards west and runs along side the northern boundary of the Bangalore-Tuskur Road and meets the southern edge of the Government Porcelain Factory Circle and proceeds further along side the northern boundary of Government Porcelain Factory which is fenced off by the Tata Institute (out of S.No. 1 of Tata Institute of Science equalling 6 acres and 22 guntas and 18 Sq. yards) and meets the south-west corner stone of Tata Institute village to join the south-east corner stone of S.No. 24 of Vaialikaval village. This excludes the Bangalore-Tuskur concrete road portion that lies within.
